

5 Travel Fellowships Available Summer 2013



In line with our aim of fostering toxicology education and careers, **EUROTOX** is delighted to offer support for up to 5 European postgraduate students/postdoctoral fellows to participate in the **2013 GRC 'Cellular and Molecular Mechanisms of Toxicity'** chaired by **Jose Manautou** (August 11-16th 2013 at Proctor Academy, New Hampshire - 1 hour bus ride from Boston).

The conference is a premier forum for showcasing the latest, most innovative advances in mechanistic toxicological research. 2013 topics include:

- mitochondrial diseases
- epigenetics
- transcriptional control of drug metabolizing enzymes
- carcinogenesis
- stem cells in toxicological research
- novel functions of oxidative stress-related transcription factors

Trainees and scientists at any level will have the opportunity to present their latest, groundbreaking work in poster format in an informal atmosphere, fostering relaxed dialog, networking and idea sharing. Gordon Conferences also facilitate social interaction of participants leading to long-lasting scientific collaborations and the lining up of trainees with laboratories for further education.

Each fellowship is for **EU1000** to provide full registration/accommodation (\$815) with the remainder (~EU£350) available to support travel.

Applicants must submit an abstract of their work for presentation to the conference – winners will be selected on scientific quality and relevance together with the likely benefit of the award to the individual's career development as a European Toxicologist. Selections will be made by the conference chair and immediate past-chair. Some abstracts may be selected for oral presentation.

Successful candidates will be asked to provide EUROTOX with a brief meeting summary for the newsletter/website by 1st September 2013.

Please apply early, as some meetings become oversubscribed (full) before this deadline. The organisers understand that applicants that are unsuccessful for these EUROTOX travel fellowships may need to withdraw their conference application if they can't find alternative sources of travel funding.
